Teach, Reach and Eat

As we noted last Sunday evening, and as it has, no doubt, been noted on several other occasions, most people are **dead** in sin and are thus in serious danger of losing their souls forever in the eternity to come: **“And you hath he quickened, who were dead in trespasses and sins” Ephesians 2:1** (1 Timothy 5:6; John 8:21,24, et al). Moreover, we all understand that as God's children, we are supposed to do **our part** to spread the life saving message of the gospel to those lost in sin (cf. 1 Corinthians 15:1-4).

We are pleased to introduce the **“Teach, Reach, & Eat”** program as one simple, and uplifting way of meeting our responsibilities. The way this will work is really quite simple as noted below:

- Once each month, a family (or an individual) will open the doors of their home to the congregation.
- Those who attend will bring an item or two for a "pot-luck" meal based on some theme.
- A few songs will be sung by all present.
- The husband of the hosting family (if he is a Christian) will then lead the group in a devotional thought (approximately 5-10 minutes in length). If the program is hosted by one of our dear widows, or by a family in which the husband is not a Christian, one of the men of the congregation will share a message.
- After the message we will break up into small groups, led by able men. We'll have a word of prayer, and then spend about an hour going door to door - talking to people in that particular neighborhood. We will **invite** these folks to the "pot-luck" meal at the host's house. Also, invitations to Sunday and Wednesday service will be extended and literature (those orange flyers) will be handed out.
- After we have sown some gospel seed, the groups will meet back at the host's home for a wonderful meal and a time of great fellowship.

Brethren, this is going to be wonderful! Please plan to be a part of these monthly 'Teach, Reach, & Eat' events. This gets under way on February 4. The hosting couple will be **Jones and Dawn Gamble**. The pot luck theme will be "Soup, Salad, and Sandwiches". The goal will be saving the lost as our Master told us:

“And Jesus came and spake unto them, saying ... Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost: Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you alway, even unto the end of the world. Amen.” - Matthew 28:18-20
