FEAR OF THE LORD

The word **fear** is used often in the bible. There's a reason for that. It's an important word and one that must apply to each of us. There mustn't be any confusion or misunderstanding. Just about always, to fear means, very simply, **to be afraid**. It comes from the Greek word **phobos** (like phobia) it doesn't usually mean “respect”. For example, would you say a claustrophobic person **respects** a closet or elevator? No, you'd say they were AFRAID of it.

Fear has a reason and **purpose** and if we don't acknowledge that, or think of it in the wrong way, it won't do what it has to in us and we'll suffer for it. Consider these five points about fear:

- 1) **Who** should we fear? Fear GOD (Heb 10:31), **not** men (Heb 13:6).
- 2) What **causes** fear? A power greater than ours, that we can neither explain or resist. The account of Ananias and Sapphira (Acts 5:11) shows **“great fear came upon all the church”**. Also read: Matthew 1:20, 14:26, Luke 1:30, 7:16.
- 3) Do we **need** to fear? Yes! The Lord tells us to **“Work out your own salvation with fear and trembling”** (Philippians 2:12).
- 4) Is there a **purpose** to fear? Yes! Fear is the **beginning** of wisdom (Proverbs 1:7). It's to get our attention, it keeps us on the path when we **first** start out: **“and walking in the fear of the Lord”** (Acts 9:31).
- 5) Is there an **end** to fear? Yes! At the end fear **must** and will be eliminated. But first we need to get there. As children, God wants us to grow (1 Peter 2:2). And as with all children, fear has an important role to play in that growth. But when we have grown to maturity, to completeness, I.e., perfection, fear is to be put aside.

“Herein is our love made perfect, that we may have boldness in the day of judgment: because as he is, so are we in this world. There is no fear in love; but perfect love casteth out fear: because fear hath torment. He that feareth is not made perfect in love.” - 1 John 4:17,18

There is no fear in love, but that's something we must grow to understand and accomplish. Let's all properly understand the fear of the Lord, and grow **with** it, and ultimately **out** of it, as the Lord intended.
