Milk and Solid Food

Over the seven Sunday's from November 24th - January 5th our morning sermons covered two topics: The Bible and The Church. This was part of a "foundational series" in which we have been, and are covering basic principles of what constitutes the church and the individual Christian. Certainly what we have covered so far was old news to many of you, but perhaps not to everyone. Being in a place which is still fairly new to me, it seemed prudent to begin with the basics or as Peter called it "milk". He wrote in 1 Peter 2:2-3, "Like newborn infants, long for the pure milk, that by it you may grow up into salvation if indeed you have tasted that the Lord is good." (ESV)

We began with four lessons on the Bible. Without the Bible we have no direction. Uniqueness of the scriptures was covered first. The Bible was given to humanity as no other writing ever has been or will be. It is the only book to contain God's revelation to man. The subsequent sermon was on the proper application of the scriptures and common mistakes made when applying them. Most notably was the removing of scripture from its context. Even when we are well intended, removing scripture from context is a misapplication of the word. The third lesson covered the completed gospel message. The Bible is complete and within the Bible is the saving gospel message of Jesus. God has nothing more to reveal to the world about how to be saved, it is all found in the Bible and to be proclaimed by His church. The final lesson the "sub-series" on the Bible came from Deuteronomy 5:1 - "hear, learn, do." Three simple words describing how we are to respond to and use the Bible.

Following lessons on the Bible was a three week study on fundamental ideas on the church. We talked about why we call ourselves the "church of Christ." We use that name for a variety of reasons but the one of most import is by saying "of Christ" we are identifying who we belong to. Next was a sermon on the planned and prophesied kingdom of God, which is His church we are all a part of. God's plan for His kingdom was spoken of by the Old Testament prophets and fulfilled by Jesus in establishing the church. Finishing off this second group of lessons was acknowledging the church as an organism, not an organization. We are viewed as an organization and even comply with state laws regarding such. However, as Jesus established the church it is a living entity, making us an organism which lives, grows, and even dies. (Continued on page 3)

Beginning last week (Jan. 12th) we moved into the third and final portion of this foundational series. This last bunch of lessons will take us through Christian practices, living, and worship. Our first lesson was on fasting, a commonly ignored Bible practice. This final grouping of lessons will by far be the largest section in our foundational series. The point of all of this can be found in Hebrews 5:11-14, where we are informed that we must move on from milk to solid food because "solid food is for the mature for those who have their powers of discernment trained by constant practice to distinguish good from evil." (ESV) Milk is necessary but at some point more is required. Moving from milk to solid food is different from person to person, even congregation to congregation, as it is with children who are learning how to eat. But developing the appetite for the solid food of the word is up to each of us individually. Spiritual food can be prepared and served, but if not eaten and digested it is wasted. It's my hope that all of us want to grow up in our salvation and become skilled in the word of righteousness.
