Original Application

The Bible is far too often read with a desire to make application without putting in the proper study. One of the most common mistakes in approaching scripture is to neglect the intended purpose for the original audience. Before applying the word in modern times it must be understood in its original setting. Truth has not and will not change, but to understand it we need to do our best to put ourselves in the place of the first recipient(s). God had the books written for specific reasons and for specific people. Consider 1 Timothy 3:14-15, the apostle Paul wrote "These things I write to you, though I hope to come to you shortly; but if delayed, I write so that you may know how you ought to conduct yourself in the house of the living God, which is the church of the living God, the pillar and ground of the truth." You can see the timeless truths very plainly: The church is still and always has been the house of the living God; the church is and always has been the pillar and ground of the truth. Additionally in these verses Paul told Timothy why he was writing the letter. Knowing why the letter was written helps us understand the book from Timothy's perspective. Everything in 1 Timothy pertains to how Timothy, the preacher at the church in Ephesus (1:3), needed to go about his work. The text in 3:1-7 of this letter is one of the places we must go to when discussing "qualifications of elders " But this is almost always done without consideration for the text outside of those seven verses. The elder is one who oversees the church. What is it that he is to oversee? He oversees the pillar and support of the truth, the house belonging to the living God. That's why a man meeting every last one of those qualifications/qualities is of the utmost importance. To lack in even one is enough to keep him from being one of the overseers of this group. Does this not add some weight to the meaning of what an elder does, and who he must be? That's not understood when we don't go beyond 3:7? The truth and application of scripture is right there in the pages you read every time. Let's do our diligence in our Bible study, let's approach scripture as God gave it and intended it and not how it suits US.

WHY WAS JESUS A MAN OF SORROWS AND GRIEF?

"He is despised and rejected of men; a man of sorrows, and acquainted with grief:" - Is. 53:3a Here's one reason:

"O Jerusalem, Jerusalem, *thou* that killest the prophets, and stonest them which are sent unto thee, how often would I have gathered thy children together, even as a hen gather-

eth her chickens under *her* wings, and ye would not!" - Matthew 23:37 Don't <u>YOU</u> add to His sorrow. Be involved in the Lord's work. Do more! He knows.

OVERCOMING HUMAN TRADITION

Many times a person will have difficulty accepting the truth taught in God's Word because it goes against what was formerly believed by the individual, and perhaps contradicts what he was always taught. This very thing happened to Alexander Campbell, who set out to restore New Testament Christianity in the 19th century. Campbell's family had always practiced infant baptism, and Campbell himself had been sprinkled. But when a child was born to Campbell and his wife in March of 1812, he determined to study the subject in light of the Bible alone.

Throwing aside the Presbyterian tradition in which he had been raised, Campbell was convinced through a study of the Bible that only penitent believers were appropriate subjects for baptism. He studied further and looked at the original language, and discovered that baptism was actually immersion.

Alexander related these conclusions to his father, Thomas Campbell, who agreed with his study. They realized that they had never been baptized into Christ. On June 12, 1812, Alexander Campbell and six others — his wife, sister, father, mother, and James Halen and his wife — were all baptized into Christ for the remission of sins.

The gospel is the power of God to save (Romans 1:16), but when men pervert the gospel it loses its power. This is the reason there are such stern warnings against changing what is revealed. "As we said before, so say I now again, If any man preach any other gospel unto you than that ye have received, let him be accursed" (Galatians 1:9). Adding to and taking away from the message is strictly forbidden (Revelation 22:18-19).

The Campbells recognized and respected the Lord's authority on the question of baptism by immersion by penitent believers, as well as other points. While Alexander Campbell is not the founder of the church of Christ, nor is he our authority in religious matters, he serves as a good example on this point that we would all do well to imitate. Search the Scriptures for the answers to religious questions, and submit to the ordinances of God.
