WHY PAUL?

The apostle Paul wrote much of the New Testament. Have you ever wondered **why** God chose **Paul** to record so much of **His** word? There were other apostles, and for some we don't even have words recorded. The Lord could have used them. Why did God choose Paul so often?

One reason may have been because Paul *knew*, more than the others whose words they were, where the *power* was; they weren't *his* words—they were **God's**:

"And my speech and my preaching was not with enticing words of man's wisdom, but in demonstration of the Spirit and of power: that your faith should not stand in the wisdom of men, but in the power of God." - 1 Corinthians 2:4,5

Paul also was **concerned** about God's people. He was zealous for them. He **wanted** them to be saved—just as God and Jesus did. Not for Paul's sake but for **their** sakes and also that **God** might be glorified for his grace and mercy. Read the first chapter of any of Paul's letters and you'll see this. For example:

"without ceasing I make mention of you always in my prayers;" Romans 1:9

But you know, above all, Paul *acknowledged God*, that it was God who was first, last and always. Paul craved God's blessing, not man's (read 2 Tim 4:8). David did, Jesus did, so did Abraham, Sara, Job, Moses etc.—all those mentioned in **Hebrews 11**. Paul didn't think anything of himself and was thankful to God for everything he had, even the comfort of his brethren in a time of need:

"And from thence, when the brethren heard of us, they came to meet us as far as Appiiforum, and the three taverns: whom when Paul saw, he thanked God and took courage." - Acts 28:15

Do we want to *accomplish* good things for the Lord? Would we like God to *choose* us? Let's follow Paul's example then. Let us believe and demonstrate *by our actions*—our faith: That God's word is the power to salvation (Romans 1:16), not ours; That we are concerned for men's souls (Philippians 2:4,5), not ourselves; and That it is God that gives the increase (1 Corinthians 3:6) and thus give God the glory, honor, praise and thanks. *Do* these things and we'll be faithful *servants*, ones God will be pleased to use: "Well done, thou good and faithful servant: thou hast been faithful over a few things, I will make thee ruler over many things: enter thou into the joy of thy lord." - Matthew 25:21

"And he gave some, apostles; and some, prophets; and some, evangelists; and some, pastors and teachers; <u>For</u> the perfecting of the saints, <u>for</u> the work of the ministry, <u>for</u> the edifying of the body of Christ: Till we <u>all</u> come in the unity of the faith, and of the knowledge of the Son of God, unto a perfect man, unto the measure of the stature of the fulness of Christ: <u>That we henceforth</u> be no more children, tossed to and fro, and carried about with every wind of doctrine, by the sleight of men, *and* cunning craftiness, whereby they lie in wait to deceive;" - Ephesians 4:11-14
