### Night Church

A Bible class teacher urged her young class to come back for the night-time service. One of the children replied, "My mommy and daddy just won't go to *night* church." Many times children "tell all," and I'm sure this was one of those times. The child was probably expressing, word for word, what the parent had verbalized on various occasions. Unfortunately, this is a problem that is entirely too prevalent in the church today.

But...what about those who "won't go" to the night services? Well, first of all, they ignore great Bible examples of night-time learning. Nicodemus went to Jesus at night for the great lesson on new birth (*John 3:3-5*). The Philippians jailor was converted at night (*Acts 16*). Peter was delivered from prison at night (*Acts 12:6-10*). The "day service only" brethren would have missed all these blessings!

Second, the "day only" brethren miss two thirds of all regular services of the church when they miss Sunday and Wednesday nights! Could a student pass in school by attending only one-third of the time? Is the success of the church less important than these?

Third, the "day only" brethren show that they do not believe such services are necessary, that they are not interested in the lost at those services, and that they will work harder for material things than for spiritual things.

### SITTING ON TWO CHAIRS

Luciano Pavarotti, the famous tenor, once told this story:

"When I was a boy, my father (a baker) introduced me to the wonders of song. He urged me to work very hard to develop my voice. Arrigo Pola, a professional tenor in my hometown of Modena, Italy, took me as a pupil. I also enrolled in a teachers college.

"On graduating, I asked my father, 'Shall I be a teacher or a singer?' "Luciana,' my father replied, 'if you try to sit on two chairs, you will fall between them. For life, you must choose one chair.'"

"I chose one. It took seven years of study and frustration before I made my first professional appearance. It took another seven to reach the Metropolitan Opera. And now, I think whether it's laying bricks, writing a book—whatever we choose—we should give ourselves to it. Commitment—that's the key. Choose one chair."

Pavarotti's words are not only good advice in choosing a career but also good spiritual advice. Too often, the mistake we make is that we are too divided. We want to focus on both the things of this world and the things of God—but it's not possible.

Pavarotti explained it this way: "If you try to sit on two chairs, you will fall between them." Jesus explained it like this:

"No man can serve two masters.

For either he will hate the one and love the other, or else he will hold to the one, and despise the other.

Ye cannot serve God and mammon" (Matt. 6:24).
